

How can you help?

The time has come for all of us to do what we can to turn the tide.

This is a time to help save our seas.

REFUSE

REDUCE

Every bit of plastic ever made still exists on our planet. Try to refuse single use items such as plastic straws and cups.

Try to avoid buying things you'll use once and throw away. Use a sandwich box for your lunch instead of plastic bags and get a refillable drinks bottle.

REUSE

RECYCLE

Encourage your family to use reusable bags when they go shopping. Keep them in the car so they don't get left at home.

Always put rubbish that can be recycled into a recycling bin and never drop litter.






Activity:

Follow the pipes to find out how you can help protect our beaches, holiday parks and environment.




Bin wipes

All baby, cleaning and face wipes should never be flushed down the toilet. Even wipes marked flushable do not break down in the pipes and can cause a blockage. Remember to keep a bin in the bathroom.

Say no to single use plastic

Switch to reusable drink cups and say no to straws to help protect marine life, seas and beaches.



Bin cotton buds

Cotton buds should always be put in the bin after use.

Recycle cooking oil

Fat, oil or grease from cooking eggs, bacon, sausages, roast dinners, stir fries and curries should never be poured down the sink. Instead wait until it cools, then bin or recycle.

Quick tips to help care for our sewers, seas and the environment
